Radio Event Scheduled at Historic Marconi Tower in Downtown Binghamton

[Binghamton, NY]

On Saturday April 21st, 2018, members of the Binghamton Amateur Radio Association (BARA) will be talking to amateur (“ham”) radio operators throughout the world from the historic Marconi Tower at 45 Lewis Street in downtown Binghamton. The event, commemorating the birth of Guglielmo Marconi (one of the inventors of radio), is held annually on the Saturday closest to Marconi’s birthday. BARA will operate from 9:00 am through 8:00 pm, contacting stations world-wide that are operating at other historic sites related to Marconi’s life and career.

The Marconi Tower is the last remaining of four towers (two in Binghamton, two in Scranton, PA) erected by Marconi in 1913 for his pioneering experiment that first successfully demonstrated radiocommunication with a fast-moving vehicle (a train running between Scranton and Binghamton). The public is invited to visit to learn more about the historic structure, and to witness amateur radio operations, which often provide local emergency communications during disasters.
